Malia Briggs, a graduating senior at the Chambersburg Area Career Magnet School, is a trailblazer who has transformed the landscape of youth bowling. She has a weighted 4.5 GPA and is ranked 7th of 183 in her class. Malia has officially signed to continue her academic and athletic journey at Tulane University, where she will join the nationally ranked Green Wave NCAA Division I Bowling Team.

Under the coaching of Joe Halula and Will Clark and with support of her parents, Malia has built one of the most decorated competitive records in Pennsylvania youth bowling history. In 2024, Malia made history by claiming the Pennsylvania High School Girls Singles State Championship title. She followed up this spectacular performance by finishing as the National Runner-Up (2nd Place) at the 2025 U.S. High School Bowling National Championship in Fort Wayne, Indiana. She returned to the state stage in 2025 to capture a bronze medal, finishing 3rd in the state singles championship.

Her impressive trophy cabinet also boasts: Seven Storm Youth Championship (SYC) Silver Medals, Two Tough Shot Tour Titles in North Carolina, A PJBT Girls Only Scratch Title, A Beast of the East Championship Title. She also finished this youth league season with a 230 average.

Beyond her trophies, Malia is a genuine pioneer in sports marketing and content creation. Driven by a passion to grow the game of bowling among youth, she has built a massive, unprecedented social media following. Boasting over 363,000 YouTube subscribers and 325,000 Instagram followers, her digital footprint exceeds that of major professional bowling tours.

Showing her athletic versatility, Malia also excelled on the basketball court, playing five years as a shooting guard and contributing to two conference championship teams.

At her high school, Malia has channeled her passion for the sport into leadership, serving as the President of the High School Bowling Club since 2024. Through this role, she introduces peers to the sport, organizes events, and builds a supportive community.
